GREAT EXPECTATIONS


Dear Church Family,

Realm Connect

Connecting & Growing Together

We are excited to announce our church is moving to a new kind of church record keeping solution, called *Realm*! It primarily serves the administrative needs of our staff, but it also offers some exciting opportunities to support the way you are involved in our church. Not only will this improve work life for our ministry staff, it will make it easier for our church family to connect to each other, keep up with what's going on, and grow as a community of believers.

Everyone in our church will have their own unique profile. Your profile contains everything you want people in our church to know about you, and enables you to join a small group, RSVP to events, track your giving, update your contact information, change family details, set notification preferences, or add a family photo.

By keeping your information current, you are helping our staff, group leaders, and our church family. Your profile includes: Contact Information (e.g. name, address, email, phone), Photo, Family Members, Personal Information (e.g. marital status, birthday, etc.), Connected Social Media Accounts. You can decide later what data you want to hide online by setting your privacy preferences. And feel free to enter your full birthday — the year and your age will not be displayed on your church directory profile. You have complete control over who can see your contact and personal information, and your contact information is never public or shareable on the internet. For safety reasons, sharing contact and personal information for children under 18 is limited, and parents have the option to determine whether or not to display their child's name in the online church directory. Also, children under 13 may not participate and will not be able to sign in.




ONLINE GIVING

Sew Study Series on Tonah Begins Sunday, November 4

Jonah is easily one of the most recognizable stories in the Bible. But it is perhaps one of most misunderstood. We teach our children about the runaway prophet who was thrown overboard into the sea only to be saved by being swallowed by a great fish. Countless retellings in sermons, bible studies, cartoons, and even vegetable forms have brought us great familiarity with this fishy tale, often obscuring its deeper and more theological message. The tragedy of this familiarity is that we have replaced some of the most sublime revelations of God and his purposes with a whale.

Over the four weeks in November, we are going to explore this short and fascinating book of a reluctant servant who disobeyed and fled from the Sovereign God. On Sunday mornings, we will zoom our lens in, exploring the book from the surface, wading verse by verse, at times word by word, through these four short chapters examining, interpreting, and applying the text during our sermon series.

But to fully appreciate and understand the message of Jonah, we must also view the book from the air. When we take our lens and zoom out from the book, we will be able to appreciate its greater contribution to the canon of Scripture. During our small group time, we will examine the book's overall themes, topics, and theological threads that are interwoven into the whole redemption story.


By taking these two complementary views of the book, we will be able to observe and gain greater understanding of who God is, how he is working in our world today to bring salvation to every corner of the globe, and how he uses rebellious, apathetic, and indifferent people to further his Kingdom on earth.

We will discover that Jonah is no hero – even after surviving three days in the belly of a great fish and bringing about one of the greatest revival awakenings in the ancient world. Truthfully, Jonah is one of the worst prophets and servants of God in the entire Bible. Yet Jonah reveals to us the True Hero of the Bible. His ordeal in a watery grave prepares us for the coming Messiah – the one who embraces death on our behalf and raises to life again three days later.

Through the prophet Jonah, the Lord reveals much about his sovereign and compassionate character and displays for us his willingness and ability to save both the prodigal and the profane.

The book will also challenge us to examine our own hearts to see if we really understand who God is and what his plans are in this world. We will face questions that will reveal our own heart's attitude toward the character and actions of God. But most importantly, we will see a shadow of the Savior who voluntarily dove into the depths of the grave on our behalf and who was raised to life, conquering death and leading captives free, and then unbelievably giving them a commission and responsibility to serve and work on His behalf.

So, please, join us for this four-week preaching series and study as we explore the story of the Reluctant Servant Jonah of the Merciful Sovereign God!
