Surely he has born our griefs and carried our sorrows; yet we esteemed him smitten by God, and afflicted. But he was pierced for our transgressions; he was crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the chastisement that brought us peace, and with his wounds we are healed. All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned — every one — to his own way; and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all.

Isaiah 53:4-6

LVBC MUSIC MINISTRY

"THE FEEL OF WORSHIP"

"But I, through the abundance of Your steadfast love, will enter Your house. I will bow down toward Your holy temple in the fear of you." Psalm 5:7

Most modern sheet music contains a tempo or movement description. It's there to give you an idea of how the song feels. I always find them funny. I looked at some of our music coming up and found a few examples. Descriptions like: "Lively Folk Feel", "Joyful, driving Pop Country", "With Passion!", "Power Ballad", "Soulful, Black Gospel Feel", and my favorite – "With Conviction" in case you needed reminding that the truths we sing needed to be sung with conviction.

Many of the Psalms have similar descriptions to give us insight to the movement and feeling of the music contained in the verses. Psalm 5, for instance, is described as a song, For the Flutes, and has the heading "Lead Me In Your Righteousness." David pleads with God to hear his prayer and give attention to his words. He acknowledges that the Holy King of Heaven alone can help him in his trouble. He also acknowledges that there is preparation that must be made. "In the morning I prepare a sacrifice for you and watch" (v.3), David says. Why? He acknowledges in verse 4 that God is "not a God who delights in wickedness," and David knows his own heart. He admits that he is boastful, evil, dishonest, bloodthirsty, and deceitful, and that kind of person cannot "stand before Your (God's) eyes" (v.6). Then what hope does David have? What hope do we have? The Psalm should end here.

<u>But</u> it doesn't. "But I, through the abundance of Your steadfast love, will enter Your house..." David enters into the presence of God through the abundance of His steadfast love and bows down in worship and reverence to this gracious and holy God. How much more do we understand this picture? Paul tells us in Romans 5 that we are justified, given peace with God through Christ Jesus, given access in Him, and now rejoice. We have hope because this steadfast love has been "poured out" in our hearts by His Spirit. We were weak, enemies of God, and His wrath was set on us. <u>But</u> God shows His love this way: "while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:1-8). What is our response to such love? David gives us an example of what a proper response looks like in the close of Psalm 5:11,12.

"Let all who take refuge in You <u>rejoice</u>; let them ever <u>sing for joy</u>, and spread Your protection over them, (so) that those who love Your Name may <u>exult in You</u>. For You bless the righteous, O LORD; You cover him with favor as with a shield."




PLANNING CENTER

A New Tool For Our Music Ministry

In February, we introduced our choir to **Services Planning Center**. Planning Center is a resource that our Praise Team and Musicians have been using for a while. Planning Center allows team members access to the service line-ups complete with the song set, sheet music, MP3's, and other resources for practice and rehearsal. Team members know what is planned, what to practice, who is scheduled, as well as many other resources. All of this in an app on your phone, or on a website!

Our teams are set up by parts (Soprano, Alto, Tenor, Bass) and in most cases even have specific rehearsal tracks for their part. This resource offers communication and extra time to practice that we often don't have outside of Wednesday night rehearsals.
