A Letter from Pastor Froy

A Heart For The Harvest

As we move toward Spring, there are several in our church family who are preparing to plant their gardens. Multiple tasks must be accomplished for the garden to be as fruitful as possible. There is the work of tilling, planting, fertilizing, and tending that must be done, all in anticipation of a harvest to come. No matter what you're attempting to grow in your garden – whether a literal vegetable garden, the garden of your family, a garden of relationships, or the garden of your heart – the ultimate goal is to reap a harvest. There are four irreducible laws of the harvest:

- 1. You reap the same kind as you sow.
- 2. You reap in a different season than when you sow.
- 3. You reap *more* than you sow.
- 4. You reap in proportion to what you sow.

These laws of the harvest are true in agriculture, but they are also true in every other aspect of our lives. Do you want to have children who are godly, who make good choices, who live lives of influence for the glory of God? What are you *sowing* into their lives to *reap* that harvest? Do you want to have victory over nagging temptation, experience a vital prayer life, and become strong in the Word of God? It all has to do with sowing and reaping.

As we seek to become an ever-increasing evangelistic and missional church (both locally and globally) we would do well to remember these Laws of the Harvest. If we want to see a harvest of genuine converts who surrender to the Lordship of Christ, we must be faithful to preach, teach, and share an unadjusted, Biblical gospel – that's Law #1. If we become impatient because we don't experience immediate results, we can be confident that our labor will not be in vain – that's Law #2. As we sow gospel seeds in our daily conversations and interactions with others, weaving them like threads into the quilt of our relationships, we can expect exponential multiplication of Kingdom growth – that's Law #3. The more we are faithful to share the gospel with others the more we will see people give their lives to Jesus, and the greater our reward in eternity – that's Law #4.

This month we have the great privilege of hosting our annual Global Impact Celebration. More information about this conference is available in this newsletter. Would you join me in praying that we would develop an ever-increasing heart for the harvest? Pray that we would do the work of tilling, planting, fertilizing, and tending to see a bountiful harvest come to fruition!
