A LETTER FROM PASTOR TROY

Living In Light Of The Resurrection

We are moving toward the conclusion of our two-year study through the Gospel of John on Sunday mornings. As we conclude the study, we will consider the multiple resurrection appearances Jesus made to a diverse cross-section of people. John concludes his account with Jesus restoring Peter to ministry, and commissioning him to the gospel call. When considering these resurrection appearances and the commission of Christ to his followers, we are confronted with this question: What does it mean to live in light of the resurrection?

David Brainerd is one such person who did just that. His legacy is even felt in our city as the Brainerd area bears his name, though he never came to Chattanooga. He gave his life as a missionary to Native Americans in Delaware. His mission began in April 1743 and was filled with many struggles - both internal and external. He battled loneliness and depression, which often left him immobilized. He eventually had to come off the mission field, after only three years, because of a physical illness which is now believed to have been tuberculosis. He died only a couple years later at the age of 29.

His personal and physical struggles, as well as his commitment to take the gospel to the Native Americans, are chronicled in his diary. It is a diary that has inspired many after him to answer the call to selfless abandon for the gospel of Jesus Christ. Following is a telling entry from his diary:

"Such fatigues and hardship as these serve to wean me more from the earth; and, I trust, will make heaven the sweeter. Formerly, when I was thus exposed to cold, rain, etc., I was ready to please myself with the thoughts of enjoying a comfortable house, a warm fire, and other outward comforts; but now these have less place in my heart (through the grace of God) and my eye is more to God for comfort."

What does it mean to live in light of the resurrection? Paul concluded it this way: "Therefore, my beloved brothers, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain." (1 Corinthians 15:58). God calls us to "work" and "labor" for him knowing that this is our temporary place of residence.

As we press into the final chapters of John together, and the final months of this year, my prayer is that we will press into the work He has called and commissioned us to do together as a covenant family of faith. May we live each day in light of the resurrection of Jesus!




PRAY FOR OUR MISSION TEAM
