Family Worship



"O holy night! the stars are brightly shining;
It is the night of the dear Savior's birth.

Long lay the world in sin and error pining,
Till He appeared and the soul felt its worth.

A thrill of hope- the weary world rejoices,
For yonder breaks a new and glorious morn!

Fall on your knees! O hear the angel voices!

O night divine, O night when Christ was born!"

These familiar words have an interesting history. In 1843, a Parish priest in Roquemaure, France convinced a young poet to write a Christmas Poem for a celebration event of a recently renovated church organ. A year later the words were set to music, and by 1847 it was premiered to the adoration of the town. In 1855 an American minister wrote the English version, which soon became popular among the abolitionist and those enslaved. Specifically, among the slaves themselves. Some of the first voices to sing these lyrics were those bound by chains, and fighting to free those in bondage. Hear them sing; sweet thrill of hope, the weary world rejoices!

"Truly He taught us to love one another; His law is love and His gospel is peace. Chains shall He break, for the slave is our brother, And in His name all oppression shall cease."

We invite you and your family to join us for our candle-light Christmas Eve Service, on Sunday, December 24, at 6:00 pm. During this special service, we will sing carols together, read scripture, and focus on the importance of the birth of Christ, as we light each symbolic candle around the advent wreath.

A Letten From Paston Troy

On June 28, 1914 the world was thrust into World War I. By December the Germans had made a strong advance into France, but the French, Belgian, and British forces were able to halt them. However, since they were not able to push the Germans out of France, there was a stalemate and both sides dug into the earth creating a large network of trenches.

On Christmas Eve, many German soldiers put up their Christmas trees, decorated with candles, on the tops of their trenches. Hundreds of Christmas trees lighted the German trenches. As the British soldiers saw them, they thought this could be some kind of trick. Instead of trickery, they heard many of the Germans celebrating.

Soon, the Germans could be heard singing as one voice some of their favorite Christmas carols. The Germans then called out to their allied counterparts in the opposite trenches to sing a favorite carol back to them. Before long, those who were hours before seeking to kill one another, were now bellowing out familiar tunes in an exchange of Christmas cheer. Then the British soldiers began to sing 'O Come All Ye Faithful,' a tune familiar to the Germans who joined in singing the Latin version, 'Adeste Fidéles.' These sworn enemies were now lifting up praises to God – together!

The amazing events which transpired the next day eventually became known as the "Christmas Day Truce." Soon soldiers from each side could be seen talking, exchanging handshakes and hugs in the middle of "No Man's Land," that area between the opposing trenches. Many began to exchange gifts of chocolates, candies, and other goodies sent to the front from loved ones back home.

As this impromptu truce continued the revelry they enjoyed turned sad and somber. Each side used this as an opportunity to bury their fallen comrades, those whose bodies previously could not be retrieved. And there, on Christmas day, they held memorial services together for those who had died.




Jersey Sunday & Food Truck Fellowship
