The Value of Community

We all need each other. This basic principle is known as "Community." None of us have every asset and resource necessary to fulfill our individual assignment on planet earth. For this reason, God invites us to discover community and to live within the freedom it brings.

Community is not always easy. People are complicated, and relationships eventually involve mess. But community is defined by people who are willing to work through the messes for your good and theirs. There are several things that result from healthy community in a church:

Community Stabilizes. Storms in life will blow your way. It happens. When life happens, you need your church community partly because you need an anchor. Sometimes the storm is doubt. Sometimes it is difficulty. Sometimes it's disorientation.

Community Interprets. People usually lack the proper perspective to interpret life events clearly. Because it is so close and personal, meaning tends to get skewed and distorted unless trusted souls walk alongside you who have the freedom to speak perspective into your life.


<u>Community Instructs</u>. Humility is that rare and wonderful ability to receive instruction and equipping from others. You have blind spots and so do !! The church community has the opportunity to encourage you and also challenge you, to comfort you and also correct you. This function flows to the extent that trust and humility reside in each heart

Community Defends. Since life happens within the context of spiritual war, it is essential to know that you have people who love you surrounding you in prayer, warring against your spiritual enemies. Your community of faith, if it's doing its job, will protect you both from the enemy and from yourself. They will identify the real foe and stand with you for victory.

Community is the essence of the Kingdom that God is bringing to earth. He intends for this interdependence to empower your life and bring you into alignment with the character of Christ. This quality of community is what we call church. I'm thankful to be a part of this covenant community with you!


Members Meeting
